### Ethiopia - The Spyridon D. Germenis collection Part II

It is quite outstanding to get such a very specialized and comprehensive collection Ethiopia - THANKS.

Spyridon "Spiros" Germenis collected it since the late 1940's when he moved with his parents from his birth place Athens (born 1939) to Addis Ababa in Ethiopia. In 1958 he left for England to read Civil Engineering, came back to Addis and married his wife Jana in 1970. The following years he worked in various countries in the Middle East, Asia, South America and Africa. From the 1990's they settled in the Czech Republic were Spiros passed away In 2014.

He left behind one of the most fascinating collection Ethiopia, and we are proud to offer as a first part some sets of the 1943 "OBELISK" issue, one of his preferred issues, as well as postal history covers, post-cards and postal stationery items.

### Spyridon D. Germenis

Spiros was born on October 20, 1939 in Athens, Greece. The eldest of three siblings, and part of a family that was by that time already largely settled in Africa, mostly in Ethiopia. Spiros moved with his parents via Alexandria to Addis Ababa in 1948, where he attended the Greek School, as well as acquired a vivid interest in stamps. In 1958 he left for England to read Civil Engineering at Brighton Polytechnic, where he stayed for 5 years.

Back in Addis following completion of his studies, he met Jana Hildprandt in 1964, as well as started his career as a structural civil engineer. He first joined the Greek construction company Myriallis, and worked on a number of projects commissioned by the Emperor, including the Kennedy Memorial Library and reconstruction of part of the Palace. He then joined Salini, an Italian construction company, continuing to work in projects across Ethiopia, before being relocated to Rome to continue working there.

"How about you move to Rome with me?", he told Jana on the phone after he had already relocated. "Is that a marriage proposal?", she asked. "Yes, why not. I suppose it is."

Spiros and Jana got married in Rome in 1970 and lived there for 2 years. He was then offered to be sent to Afghanistan for a construction project on his own for 2 years but chose to move with Jana to Athens instead, to work for Vacuum Concrete, a large Greek construction company. The couple relocated to Greece in 1972, with Spiros spending the next 10 years working in and leading large projects all over the Middle East, Iran, Africa, South America, India and Pakistan, before moving with Jana to Indonesia for two years in order to work on projects in Southeast Asia.

The year 1981 saw the arrival of Spiros and Jana's only son, Stephanos, also probably signifying a shift towards a more settled lifestyle. Following a few years with CCC, a Palestinian-owned construction company, Spiros formed his own company dealing with construction projects across Greece.

News of property previously confiscated by the Communist regime in Czechoslovakia, now being given back through restitution to its original owners, emerged following the events of 1989 in Eastern Europe. After a few years of back-andforth travel between Athens and Prague and living in between the two, Spiros and Jana eventually fully settled in 1996 in what eventually became the Czech Republic, to receive and manage Jana's ancestral property, including a chateau in Southwest Bohemia. Stephanos followed shortly after.

Life in the Czech Republic in the 1990s was challenging and very different to the Mediterranean, Africa and Southeast Asia, even for a couple who lived abroad all their lives. With hard work and a lot of patience, they made the rather small town of Blatna their new home. However, old values and habits are not easily forgotten. Doro wot and kik alicha were, to the surprise of dinner guests not having lived in Ethiopia, a standard part of the menu, with Stephanos often secretly emptying the jar of berbere into the pot, often to his dad's dismay. Spiros and Jana spent much of the period during 1999-2008 traveling to England, mostly for two reasons: to visit their son who had moved there to study and work, and to purchase injera and Ethiopian coffee. Spiros' stamp collection had in the meantime grown significantly as well, focusing entirely on Ethiopian stamps. He actively sought not only to widen his collection, but also to meet fellow enthusiasts.

For Spiros and his family, Ethiopia was initially a place of escape from post-war Europe and civil warridden Greece. Perhaps it was viewed as a tangent, a detour, a parenthetical period before returning back to "normality". However, 40 years after leaving Addis and more than 60 years after having set foot there for the first time, it is Ethiopian furniture that is scattered all over the Germenis household in both Athens and Blatna, doro wot is the family's only unanimously favorite dish, it is Spiros' stamp albums that slowly but surely occupied an entire room, and it is Ethiopia that a whole generation of Spiros' wider family, which although never lived nor have been there, yearns to some day visit.

Indeed, Ethiopia was much more than something just temporary.

Spiros passed away in Prague on July 22, 2014 after a 9-month long fight with cancer.




